Katha's been blessing this congregation with her musical gifts since December 1, 1985. (And I can't tell you how much she wanted to be able to make it to that 36-year anniversary!) And before her time here in Oronoco (and Zumbrota before the yoke was dissolved in 2017), she played her beautiful music in many other congregations. In fact, Katha's been playing in church since she was 12 years old – first in the churches where her father was the pastor, and then other churches after that. Admittedly, though, after 70 years behind the keyboard, I think we can all agree that Katha's earned some incredibly well-deserved rest.

I know I'm not the only one that's going to feel an unmistakable absence in the sanctuary with us on Sunday mornings – her smile, her laugh, her sincerity, her faith. And I know she wouldn't mind a chat if anyone wanted to give her a call to check in. We're working on coming up with a time and a way we can celebrate her in a worship service, and when we get that worked out, we'll get that information out ASAP.

Until then, we lift up prayers of overwhelming thanksgiving and prayers of healing for Katha.

### From the Pastor ...

December 21.

The winter solstice.

The longest night of the year.

The sun will rise at 7:42 a.m. and set at 4:35 p.m., giving us a mere 8 hrs. and 53 mins. of daylight.

It's a day that's been celebrated in one way or another for millennia in ways that both honor the long darkness and celebrate the returning of the light in the

morning. Rituals and celebrations of the winter solstice around the world and throughout the ages have included things like gift-giving, dancing, games, purification rites, prayers, feasts, the telling of ancient and sacred tales, and gathering with friends and family.

It's not often a day we mark in the Christian tradition. Too often, we get swept up into the glitz and gleam of the holiday season (usually far sooner than we'd like to as stores set out their Christmas merchandise/displays earlier and earlier). Too often, we get swept up in the cheery carols and manic to-do lists whether our hearts are feeling the joy and anticipation of the season or not. And if we're not feeling that joy and that cheer – if we're hurting ... if we're lonely ... if we're grieving ... if we're anxious ... if we're uncertain – we feel unseen. We feel like there's something wrong with us. We feel swallowed up by those 15 hrs. and 7 mins. of darkness, unsure whether we can even find the light again.

Fortunately, more and more, Christian churches are starting to recognize and acknowledge the need to make space for all the experiences of the holiday season – the cheerful ones and the troubling ones. More and more congregations are holding a special service before Christmas – a service dedicated to holding sacred time for those who need to find quietness and contemplation, rest and healing in the midst of the holiday rush. Some call it a Blue Christmas service. Others call it a Service of Longest Night. A couple of years ago, Weekend Editions (a program on National Public Radio) did a piece on Blue Christmas/Longest Night services. In that piece, Deena Prichep spoke with Ben Stewart, professor of worship at the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago, and Stewart points out, "There's this sense at Christmas that God's own self identifies with that sort of aloneness, and comes to be with people. ... Christians need liturgies and theologies deep enough to hold the darkness – the blue alongside the Christmas joy. But it's a deep, hopeful, midnight blue – one that has us looking toward the dawn."

So on Tuesday, December 21 at 7:00 p.m., that is exactly what we will do. We will hold a Quiet Christmas service. We will hold sacred space and time for all those feeling that aloneness and needing to feel the blue alongside the joy. Because in reality, we cannot have light without darkness, and we

cannot have darkness without light. We do not stay in the darkness of the night because the dawn is coming. So whether that light is bright and brilliant or small and flickering for you this holiday season, know that your experience is valid. You are seen. You are love. You are precious in God's eyes. And there is a place for you here.

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light. On those living in a pitch-dark land, light has dawned. - Isaiah 9:2.

# **Busy Bags for Ronald McDonald House**



### **Advent 2021: Salvation Comes...**

As we journey through the season of Advent together this year, we'll do so with different Scriptures that give voice and vision to the coming Savior. We'll begin with the words of three different prophets who foretold the coming of God's salvation – the prophet Jeremiah, the prophet Ezekiel, and the prophet Isaiah. And just before we celebrate the birth of the Christ-child on Christmas Eve, we'll move to the prophetic words that begin the gospel of John. We'll spend the season contemplating the ways in which salvation comes:

- November 28 Jeremiah 29:1, 4-14: Salvation Comes in the Waiting
- December 5 Ezekiel 37:1-14: Salvation Comes in Breath
- December 12 Isaiah 55:1-13: Salvation Comes in Abundance
- December 19 John 1:1-18: Salvation Comes in the Word

We have recently set up a special account with the Presbyterian Foundation that affords us the capacity for online giving. *NOTE: This is different than the automatic electronic giving that many of you have already signed up for. This online giving does not affect that monthly or bimonthly system in any way.* 

This online giving is both safe and secure. It can be a one-time donation or can be set up on a schedule. It's a great opportunity for anyone who can't join us and contribute an offering on a regular basis. It's also a great opportunity for guests, whether they're here for a Sunday morning service or a special service like a wedding or funeral.

### **Christmas Cookie Sale**

Date: **Saturday, December 4** Time: **9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.** 

Cost: \$7 per pound

We've had so many people asking about our Christmas cookie sale again – asking Pastor Lisa, asking through Facebook, calling the church, and asking various congregation members. After much



discussion with both the Session and the congregation after worship, we've decided that we can hold our Christmas cookie sale again this year but with a few alterations to procedure.

- 1. All boxes will be prepackaged by church volunteers wearing masks and gloves. There will be 2 different weights: 1 lb. and 2 lbs.
- 2. All boxes will include the same kinds of cookies. To ensure that, we're going to ask everyone who wants to contribute cookies to bake 20 dozen of one kind of cookie instead of all sorts of different kinds. We'll also have a sign-up to be sure we don't end up with multiple people contributing sugar cookies or gingerbread cookies (so if you want to contribute one of those, sign up early!)
- 3. Everyone coming to pick up a box of cookies will sign up beforehand using a Google form (in progress). On the form, people will let us know what size box they'd like (and whether they'd like more than one box), whether they want a nut-free box, what time they'll be picking up their box in 15-min. slots, and who will be picking it up. We'll be able to limit the responses to 10 people per 15-min. slot so we don't have crazy traffic back-ups on Minnesota Ave. .

### We'll label the boxes:

- a. By the name of who's picking it up
- b. By weight
- c. With a list of the cookies in the box
- d. If it's a nut-free box

As always, we make sure everyone knows that our cookies are all baked in private homes, so we cannot guarantee no cross-contamination for nut allergies.

Also, we are considering a "drop in" time to come pick up cookie boxes at the end – perhaps the last 30 mins. – for anyone that didn't or couldn't sign up using the Google form. For that drop-in time, it would be first come, first serve. When the cookie boxes are gone, they're gone.

On December 3, we will also need at least **6 people** to pack and label the boxes. And on December 4, we'll need at least **6 people** to help distribute the boxes and make change. There are 2 sign-up sheets on the bulletin board at church – one for the cookies (please write what kind of cookie you're planning on making/bringing so we don't double up) and one for those coming to work either on Friday or Saturday (or both!)

We've got full-sized fliers as well as ¼-sheet mini-fliers that need to be distributed around the area. We've also got a Facebook event (search for "Oronoco Christmas Cookie Sale") that you can share on your own Facebook pages. Help us get the word out!

## 2021 Budget Deficit

We know that the last 21 months (and counting) have been difficult in a lot of ways. As you know, they haven't been easy for the church either. Because we are the church together and because we want to be as open and transparent as possible, the Session thinks it's important to share our current budget situation with you.

As of the November Session meeting, we are running over our budget. On a month-by-month basis, our average budget is \$7,237– a budget that we've stuck to pretty consistently. However, our monthly income has been running behind projected.



# Per CapitaThe "GLUE" That Holds Presbyterians Together

#### What is it?

The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. We worship, serve, and govern together. Per capita contributions fund the shared governing responsibilities for the whole church (Presbytery, Synod, General Assembly), no matter the size of an individual church

### How old is it?

It is mentioned in the Synod of Philadelphia minutes in 1738!

### How much is it?

In 2021, \$36.50 per member. And as per the vote during the November 11 Presbytery meeting, the 2022 per capita will also be \$36.50.

### Where does the money go?

66% to our Presbytery; 17% to our Synod; 17% to the General Assembly (National Office).

### Why is it important?

Per capita monies support the work of the church globally to nationally to locally, including the technology grant we received earlier this year to worship remotely.

### What is our church's policy?

It is, and has been, the policy of the Presbyterian Church of Oronoco to pay our per capita every year, whether individual members have contributed their portion or not.

### Have I paid this year?

If you are not sure, please contact Ellen Warner (ellenjwarner@gmail.com) to find out.

### How do I pay?

You can write a check to the Presbyterian Church of Oronoco and simply write "per capita" on the memo line.

### **Winter Weather Procedure**

Please be sure we have your accurate contact information in case of a weather-related closing. We want to be sure everyone remains safe during this frigid season.


# **Quiet Christmas Service**


