Summer sermon series: “Gifts of the Dark Woods”



Gifts of the Dark Woods: Seven Blessings for Soulful Skeptics is an incredibly book written by Dr. Eric Elnes, a pastor, author, and speaker who hosts an online community (“Darkwood Brew”) “for an engaging exploration of Convergence Christianity.” His book explores the different ways our experiences in the Dark Woods are not something to be feared but instead are gifts and ways to encounter God. The seven gifts/blessings that Dr. Elnes addresses are: the gifts of uncertainty, emptiness, being thunderstruck, getting lost, temptation, disappearing, and the gift of misfits. “This is a book for anyone who feels awkward in their search for God, who seeks to find holiness amid their holy mess, who prefers practicality to piety when it comes to finding their place in this world.”

Throughout the summer, we will be tackling one of these gifts each Sunday – talking about what it is, where we find its presence and blessing in Scripture, and how we can embrace it instead of shying away from it in our own walks of faith.

A Message from Our Pastor



I'm at Synod School as I sit and write this month's newsletter article, and one of the classes that I'm taking this year is a class on the enneagram.

The enneagram is "a study of the nine basic types of people. It explains why we behave the way we do, and it points to specific directions for individual growth. It is an important tool for improving relationships with family, friends, and co-workers." Each of the nine types – the Reformer, the Helper, the Achiever, the Individualist, the Investigator, the Loyalist, the Enthusiast, the Challenger, and the Peacemaker – comes with its own prescriptions and predictions for a person's motivations, personality traits, strengths, pitfalls, etc. It originated in the Sufi tradition in the Middle East hundreds of years ago but has been adapted throughout the centuries by monks, spiritual directors, and those in the business world ... just to name a few.



Of course, the enneagram is by no means the only personality test/explanation tool out there. Most people are familiar with the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (<http://www.myersbriggs.org>). Others have taken the DiSC Inventory (<http://www.discprofile.com>). On my journey through the ordination process, I had to take the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory (MMPI). And those are just a few of the other tools out there that people have used, are using, and will continue to use to try to gain insight into who they are and why they act/think/behave the way they do.

As humans, we seem to be obsessed with the idea of peeling back whatever layers we think we have to better understand what's underneath. What undergirds our emotions? Our actions? Our reactions? Why are we the way we are? Who are we really? People have spent their whole lives and thousands of dollars trying to figure this out. There's something innate within us that strives to better understand ourselves. We want so desperately to know who we are – who we *really, truly* are inside.

And yet even as we strive, Paul's words to the Christians in Rome echo through the eons in our heads and in our hearts:

All who are led by God's Spirit are God's sons and daughters. You didn't receive a spirit of slavery to lead you back again into fear, but you received a Spirit that shows you are adopted as his children. With this Spirit, we cry, "Abba, Father." The same Spirit agrees with our spirit, that we are God's children. ~ Romans 8:14-16

Friends, no matter who we are or what a zillion different personality tests say about us, we are children of God.

Period.
End of story.
Beginning of story.
Middle of story.
All the story.

This is an identity that cannot be taken away from us. It cannot be tarnished. It doesn't need to be unraveled or tweaked. So whether you identify as an introvert or extrovert, a 7 or a 4, or some other personality designation that hasn't even been invented yet, we are one thing for sure: children of God.

But just in case you're wondering, your pastor is an INFJ and an enneagram 9 with a strong 1 wing. 😊

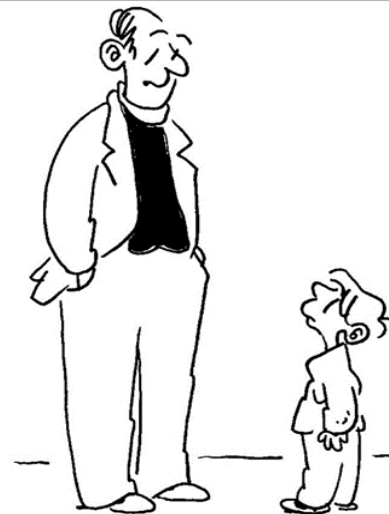

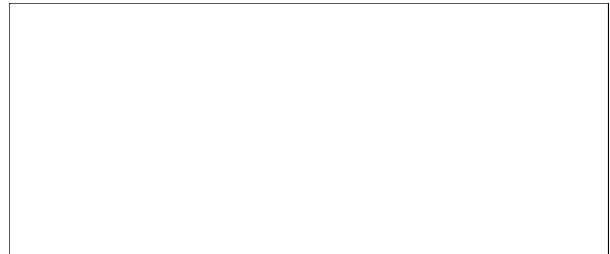
