# A Message from Our Pastor

## WRITER'S BLOCK.

Maybe it's because there's a lot going on – in my own family life and in the life of the church. Maybe it's because the summer is wrapping up and this time of year is always a little slowness-inducing. I could say it's because I'm sleep-deprived, but you've probably all heard me say that our new baby sleeps through the night already.

For whatever reason, any good ideas I may have had have flown out the window ... probably because it looks so darn nice out there! 😊

Often, when we consider talking about our faith, we feel inadequate. We feel like we come up short – like we're unsure of the “right” words to us, the “right” way to express ourselves, the “right” things to say in terms of theology and church lingo and everything else. I wish I had a dollar for every time someone said to me, “I can't speak about my faith in public. I didn't go to seminary. I don't know what to say.”

Okay, folks ... I *did* go to seminary ... and here I sit today NOT KNOWING WHAT TO SAY.

It reminds me of a scene from one of my favorite movies – *National Treasure*. The basic premise of the movie is that Nicholas Cage is a historian and treasure hunter who's spent his whole life searching for the lost treasure of the Knights Templar. At the beginning of the movie, he's trying to riddle out one of the many clues that he finds along the trail of this treasure, and he's solicited the help of the people around him. They're all trying to work out what this specific clue might be referring to when one of the less intelligent characters spouts off a theory that comes out of left field – something that is only marginally related to what everyone else is talking about and is almost certainly *not* what the clue is referenc-

ing. When he does this, one of the other characters (the “comic relief” guy), says, “Snorkel! See I can do it, too. Albuquerque!” The comic relief character is poking fun at the less-than-intelligent character for blurting out what sounds like random words as opposed to offering a truly helpful thought.

Sometimes, when we consider talking about our faith, we feel like that – like what we're saying makes little sense with what's going on around us as opposed to offering something useful, thoughtful, or polished. We feel like, instead of coming up with something wise and inspiring and faith-filled, we're just blurting out random words. Trust me ... there are PLENTY of times I've felt like that myself (including today as I write this newsletter article).

Thankfully, we are far from alone in feeling like this. Even the apostle Paul struggled with saying the “right” thing. But Paul also reminds us that it's not up to us to say the perfect thing:

*In God's wisdom, he determined that the world wouldn't come to know him through its wisdom. Instead, God was pleased to save those who believe through the foolishness of preaching. Jews ask for signs, and Greeks look for wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, which is a scandal to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles. But to those who are called—both Jews and Greeks—Christ is God's power and God's wisdom. This is because the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.*  
– 1 Corinthians 1:21-25

So when it comes to sharing your faith, be encouraged! Don't be afraid to say the “wrong” thing because God is working through you for good, using even the most random, seemingly nonsensical testimonies to spread the good news of Christ and the love of God to all those who need to hear it.

## Summer sermon series: “Gifts of the Dark Woods”

*Gifts of the Dark Woods: Seven Blessings for Soulful Skeptics* is an incredible book written by Dr. Eric Elnes, a pastor, author, and speaker who hosts an online community (“Darkwood Brew”) “for an engaging exploration of Convergence Christianity.” His book explores the different ways our experiences in the Dark Woods are not something to be feared but instead are gifts and ways to encounter God. The seven gifts/blessings that Dr. Elnes addresses are: the gifts of uncertainty, emptiness, being thunderstruck, getting lost, temptation, disappearing, and the gift of misfits. “This is a book for anyone who feels awkward in their search for God, who seeks to find holiness amid their holy mess, who prefers practicality to piety when it comes to finding their place in this world.”

Throughout the summer, we will be tackling one of these gifts each Sunday – talking about what it is, where we find its presence and blessing in Scripture, and how we can embrace it instead of shying away from it in our own walks of faith.

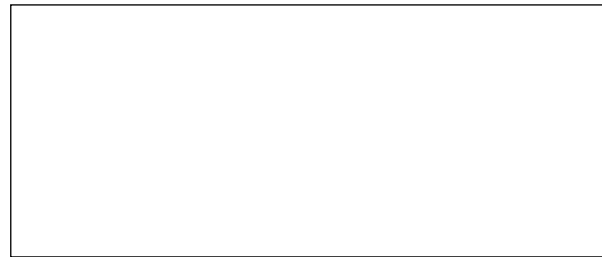
